Role: Green Ambassador

Department: Student Activities

Opportunity: As Green Ambassador, you will be responsible for the organisation, recruitment, development and management of the Green Impact projects already planned, with the flexibility to implement your own ideas and plans.

Benefits: As a student leader, you will be part of the Ethical and Environmental committee and will liaise with green charities and the Students' Union which will enhance your communication skills and allow opportunities for networking. We will recognise our Green Ambassador with certificates, references and CV enhancing opportunities.

Duties and responsibilities: The student leader is responsible for liaising with the Students' Union, sustainability charities and volunteers. The leader is required to represent the interests of sustainability around campus and look towards developing further plans on green issues at Bucks. The Green Ambassador is required to:

- liaise with volunteers, green charities, the Ethical and Environmental committee, and the Activities Coordinator (Volunteering & Charity Fundraising)
 - advertise green events throughout the year
 - have an overall responsibility for championing green issues and sustainability at Bucks, and its successes
 - encourage members of the University to partake in Green activities
 - encourage members of the University to partake in charitable activities
 - work alongside the Activities Coordinator (Volunteering & Charity Fundraising) to complete the NUS Green Impact accreditation
 - encourage and advertise sustainability feedback surveys.

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Training and support: You will receive leadership training and have an outlet for concerns by attending Ethical and Environmental meetings.

Time commitment: Approximately six hours per month.

Timeframe: Fixed for one academic year.

Qualification requirements: No prior experience required.

Method of appointment: Democratic vote by our Students' Union members during elections in the second term.

Venue: High Wycombe and Uxbridge campuses.

Responsible to: Activities Coordinator (Volunteering & Charity Fundraising).

Operates alongside: Activities Coordinator (Volunteering & Charity Fundraising) and related ambassadors.
