They publish a range of reference points and guidance including the Quality Code and they review and report on how they meet their responsibilities, identify good practice and make recommendations for improvement. *gaa.ac.uk*

Higher Education Statistics Agency (HESA)

Guild HE

Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE)

Distributes public money for teaching and research to universities and colleges. In doing so, it aims to promote high quality education and research, within a financially healthy sector. The Council also plays a key role in ensuring accountability and promoting good practice. hefce.ac.uk

National Student Survey (NSS)

This is a survey of all final year undergraduates which gauges student satisfaction across a number of key areas from teaching and learning to assessment and feedback *thestudentsurvey.com*

Student Written Submission (SWS)

A document written by students for the QAA which reflects in their words what the academic experience is like at their institution. This is done as part of an institutional Review.

Office of the Independent Adjudicator (OIA)

Has a wide remit to examine student complaints about 'the omissions and commissions' of HEIs. It does not examine issues of academic judgment or admissions issues. *oiahe.org.uk*

Higher Education Review (HER)

The overall aim of Higher Education Review is to inform students and the wider public whether a provider meets the expectations of the higher education sector for setting and/ or maintenance of academic standards, provision of learning opportunities, provision of information and the enhancement of the quality of students' learning opportunities.

Higher Education Academy (HEA)

Organisation which aims to support the sector in providing the best possible learning experience for all students – this includes support for academics through the Subject Centres, awarding National Teaching Fellowships and undertaking research.

Sabbatical Officer

The President, the Vice President Education and Welfare and the Vice President Student Involvement make up our three Sabbatical Officers. They are elected annually in March and hold office for one year from 1 July to 30 June taking a year out from studying or at the end of their course. Any current student can run to be a Sabbatical.

Union Council

The chance for every student to hold the sabbatical officers to account, often with guest speakers. In the past the Vice Chancellor and Deputy Vice Chancellor have attended.

The Big Deal

Support package for students at Bucks. Includes free events, entertainment and recreational activities as well as paid representation.

Vice President Education and Welfare (VPEW)

One of the elected sabbatical officers who is your voice at many University meetings, currently your VPEW is Jenny Wade. Elections happen in early March for the following academic year.

Education Forum

A Students' Union meeting between the representation team and the Senior reps, held three times a year and often called Ed Forum. This is a valuable meeting where the Senior reps can directly influence where the representation team focus their energy.

Know your Institution

Design, Media & Management (DMM)

DMM combine a range of disciplines spanning the creative and cultural industries, servicing public and private sector organisations and integrating a range of diverse disciplines.

Society & Health (S&H)

S&H have innovative courses that help people hit the ground running in their chosen careers when they graduate. Geared towards the needs of NHS and health workers in the independent sector.

Mitigating Circumstances (Mit Circs)

Process for students to request an extension or additional attempt if they feel their work has been affected by unforseen or unexpected issues beyond the normal stresses of life. All requests should be supported by independent evidence and will be accepted or rejected following confidential review.

Academic Misconduct

There are four different types of academic misconduct, Plagiarism, Collusion, Cheating and Impersonation. If a student is accused of any type of misconduct it will be investigated thoroughly before any action is taken.

Professional Services Employee (PSE)

PSEs keep the University running and are non academic members of University staff. The main places that you will encounter PSEs are as the secretaries to your PCMs and they are the ones who help you at your Faculty Desks.

Head of Academic Department (HoAD)

Member of University staff responsible for managing their department, Senior reps should speak to their HoAD on a regular basis and give them any feedback they have about their department.

Council

This is the University's governing body and makes crucial strategic decisions around finance and planning that affect the student experience. Students are represented through the President of the Students' Union. Most of the Council members are independent of the University.

Senate

This is the University's most senior academic committee and is responsible for maintaining the standard and quality of our academic provision. Students are represented through the President of the Students' Union and the Vice President Education & Welfare

Programme Committee Meeting (PCM)

These committees deal with academic affairs and standards for courses at a local level (within the portfolio). The main meeting for student reps to give their feedback.

Validation

Validation and approval is the quality assurance process by which the University ensures that all new or revised qualifications are valid, credible and fit for purpose.

Periodic Department Review (PDR)

The periodic review process provides a focus on academic standards, the scholarship of academic staff and their engagement with the pedagogy of their discipline.

Partner College

Aylesbury College, Amersham and Wycombe College, BCA, UCFB and Activate Learning Oxford are some of the UK based Colleges that run Bucks courses. There are also international Partner Colleges in Italy, Belgium, Netherlands, Malaysia and Sri Lanka.

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
